- 4. Students need complete the Enrollment Form (see Appendix A) which includes a Project Title, the Research Question and an Abstract (see Appendix C for guidelines on Research Question and Abstract).
- 5. At the end of the project, they will prepare an A0 size poster to report on their results which will be displayed at the YE 23 Conference.
- 6. They will also give a 15 minutes verbal presentation at the Conference.
- 7. Applicants who complete and presented their project will receive Certifications recognizing their accomplishments.
- 8. Qualified projects will be invited to prepare a paper for publication on ResearchGate.



Appendix C – Research question and Abstract Guideline

This is the question that you hope your work will answer or attempt to answer. It should be one question only. Below are some typical research questions from past projects:

- How does the renovation, presence and community of Hong Kong International School impact the local fauna?
- Which popular beach in Hong Kong has the worst polluted water?
- Does the Hong Kong Power Station emissions meet the World Health Organization pollution recommendations?
- Does Zinc oxide make a good semi-conductor?

You may add a short section to list out the papers, notes and ideas that have led up to the research question. This is optional but may be added if the question needs some clarification or basis. Below are some resources listings:
